# • Youth Allowance Update - Good News for Rural and Remote Students

In September 2018, legislation passed (Social Services Legislation Amendment (Student Reform) Bill 2018 which will see the implementation of one of the 2018 Federal Budget announcements, the increase of the parental income cut-off for regional, rural and remote students accessing the regional workforce independence criteria from \$150,000 to \$160,000,

plus \$10,000 for each additional child in the family. This measure will commence on 1 January 2019. Information on *Youth Allowance - Independent through work: Part-time work or earnings for rural and remote students* can be found <u>here</u>.

### • SCHOLARSHIPS

Rural and Regional Enterprise Scholarship Program The Rural and Regional Enterprise Scholarships Program supports undergraduate, postgraduate and Vocational Education and Training (VET) students to attend an institution to undertake a Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) course, including in the fields of Health or Agriculture. STEM fields include the following broad fields of study: Natural and Physical Sciences, Information technology, Engineering and Related technologies, Agriculture, Environmental and Related studies and Health (except Complementary Therapies).

The scholarships are valued at up to \$18,000 each and are available to support students studying from six months full-time and up to 8 years part-time, on campus, or through online and distance education. The scholarships are open to students from regional and remote areas in Australia and are for Certificate IV to PhD courses. A further \$500 is available to scholarships recipients to support an internship.

# Applications are now open and close on Friday, 14 December 2018.

All supporting documents are due no later than Sunday, 13 January 2019.

Horizon Scholarship The AgriFutures™ Horizon Scholarships in partnership with industry sponsors, are on offer to students enrolled in their last two years of a full-time agricultural-related university degree or a Science, Technology, Engineering,



Maths/Finance (STEM) degree with relevant majors which align to agriculture. It provides a \$5,000 bursary per year for the **final** two years of the student's course, professional development workshops and mentoring, annual industry work placements and the opportunity to network and gain knowledge at industry events to facilitate career readiness and connection with industry networks. Applications for the 2018 Horizon Scholarship open **7 January 2019**. Connellan Airways Trust Award 2018 The Connellan Airways Trust will open the EJ Connellan Award for 2019 on 1 December 2018 and close on 31 January 2019. The EJ Connellan Award provides an opportunity for individuals living in outback Australia to undertake further study or research that otherwise may not be available to them. The EJ Connellan Award provides financial support in two categories: Junior 16-25 years of age and Senior 26 years of age and

#### **Nbn and ACCAN attendance**

ICPA (Aust) and Better Internet For Rural, Regional And Remote Australia (BIRRR) were part of a forum at the Nbn Australia Local Conference in Sydney. ICPA (Aust) President Wendy Hick and Communications Portfolio leader Kristen Coggan highlighted issues faced by rural, regional and remote students and how they rely on nbn for access to their education. Emphasis was placed on the need for the education port to be extended to tertiary students and small school students needing to complete schoolwork online.

Wendy and Kristen then attended the ACCAN Conference where Wendy participated as a panellist to the affirmative team of "The Great Debate - 'Always on' broadband is essential". Thank you to these two ladies and BIRRR for their keeping our voice in the forefront.
